What is LIBSENSE?

- Initiated in 2016 by the WACREN with support of sister regional RENs in AfricaConnect2 as a Library - NREN collaboration to build information management capabilities
 - Library Support for Embedded NREN Services and E-infrastructure) ⇒ the sensible thing to do at the time :-)
- Evolved from 2018 into a continent-wide initiative to expand open science in Africa, based on strategies and solutions that work in the African context.






LIBSENSE – Strategy & Organisation
